

Koch Lecture, Dr. Gayle Fritz

Cahokia's Farmers and Fields: Legacies and Lessons



Recent research at Cahokia and other Mississippian sites in the Greater American Bottom region of western Illinois and eastern Missouri spotlights the diversity of the populace and the complexity of coordinated activities needed for successful food production in that densely populated area. The importance of women as both symbols and actors has become more apparent than ever. This is my base for discussing women's roles as farmers, economic decision makers, spiritual leaders, and agents of social integration in an urban, multiethnic society. In an attempt to bridge ancient and modern eras, I also talk about the potential for attaining higher levels of agrobiodiversity through re-domestication of lost crops of the Eastern Agricultural Complex and conducting research on field systems that include many species in addition to corn.

Sunday Workshop: Identifying Projectile Points

This workshop will focus on the identification of projectile point types in Missouri and areas that border Missouri. Discussions will focus on various morphological and measurement attributes (or characteristics) of the stem and blade portions of projectile points. If time permits, all 53 points described in Ray's book *Projectile Point Types in Missouri and Portions of Adjacent States* will be discussed. Detailed examination of

these attributes help distinguish between look-alike point types. Heat treatment, age range, geographic distribution, and general comments regarding each point type and look-alike specimens will also be discussed. The cost for this workshop will be \$2 for students and MAS members and \$5 for all other attendees. Attendees are encouraged to bring artifacts to be identified and/or for use in the class.



Conference Venue

The meeting will be at the Lodge at Old Kinderhook. Special rates for a king or two queens will be \$93/night, plus tax.
